

# Network Readiness Index 2025

## Nicaragua

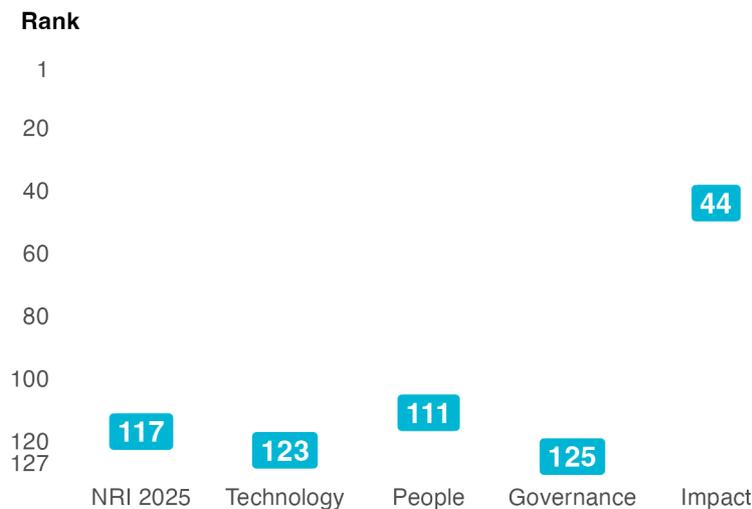
Figure 1: The NRI 2025 model

The Network Readiness Index (NRI) is one of the leading global indices on the application and impact of information and communication technology (ICT) in economies around the world. In its latest version of 2025 the NRI Report maps the network-based readiness landscape of 127 economies based on their performances in four different pillars: Technology, People, Governance, and Impact. Each of these pillars is itself comprised of three sub-pillars (see Figure 1) that have been populated by a total of 53 variables.

### Global NRI position of Nicaragua

Nicaragua ranks 117 out of the 127 economies included in the NRI 2025 (Figure 2). Its main strength relates to Impact. The greatest scope for improvement, meanwhile, concerns Governance.

### Performance at sub-pillar level

When it comes to sub-pillars, the strongest showings of Nicaragua relate to SDG Contribution, Quality of Life and Economy, among others (Table 1). More could be done, though, to improve the economy's performances in the Trust, Regulation and Future Technologies sub-pillars.

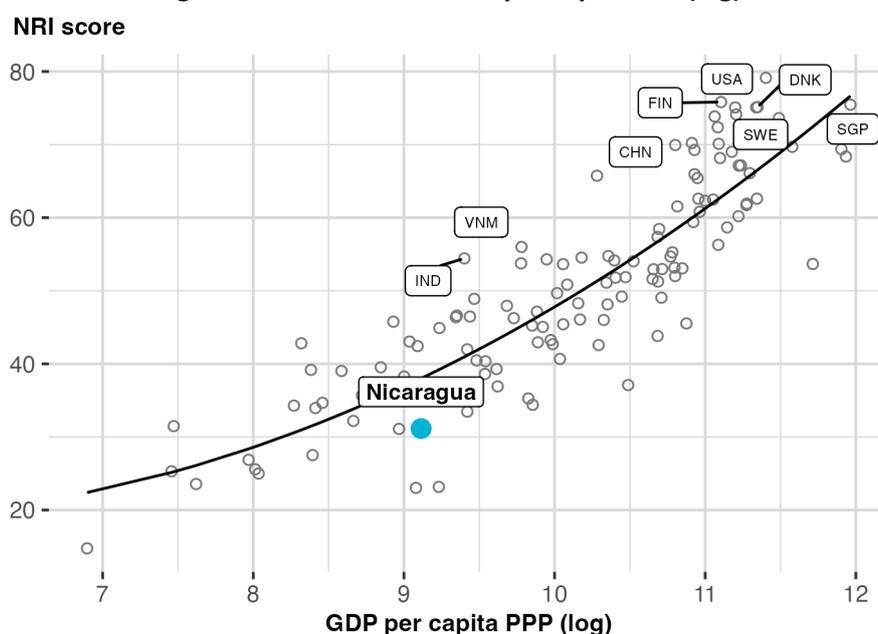

### NRI score and income

Figure 3 shows the position of Nicaragua in terms of both NRI score and GDP per capita (PPP). The trend line shows the expected NRI score given an economy's income level. As can be seen, Nicaragua is well below the trend line, which suggests that it is underachieving and that one would expect it could raise its network readiness in view of its income level.

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## Performance against its income group and region

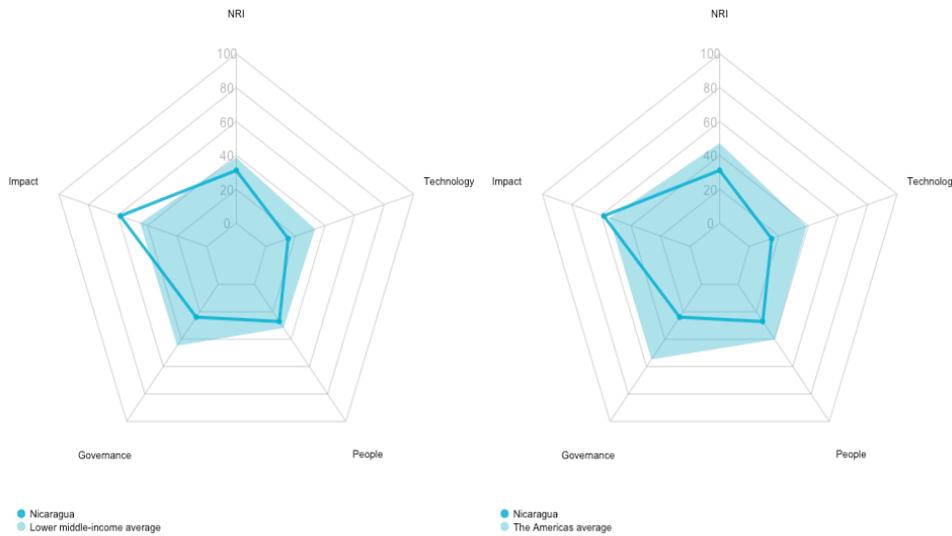
### Lower-middle-income countries

Nicaragua is ranked 28th in the group of lower-middle-income countries (Figure 4, left panel). In terms of pillar performance, it has a score higher than the income group average in one of the four pillars: Impact. At the sub-pillar level, it outperforms lower-middle-income countries in four of the twelve sub-pillars: Individuals, Economy, Quality of Life and SDG Contribution.

### The Americas

Nicaragua is ranked 21st within The Americas (Figure 4, right panel). It has a score above the regional average in one of the four pillars: Impact. With regard to sub-pillars, it outperforms the average in The Americas in three of the twelve sub-pillars: Economy, Quality of Life and SDG Contribution.
